Please read this registration package for Bronze Medallion Course. To secure a place on this course, ALL of the following are required by Wednesday 11th November 2021:

- 1. Complete your Jan Juc SLSC 2021/2022 Membership.
- 2. Submit the online Jan Juc SLSC Registration Form.
- 3. Pay the full course fees via your SLSA Members Area account.
- 4. Complete the LSV Online Course Registration.

5. Double dose of **COVID-19 vaccination** and submitted certificate on **LSV Vaccination Status Form**.

The following MUST be brought with you on the first day of the course (Monday 15th November):

6. A completed **Timed Pool Swim** (paper form).

Registrations will close once the 16 available places are filled.

Course details:

Bronze Medallion is a fun, although very busy (42 hour) course. Candidates will learn theoretical and practical components crucial to lifesaving, as well as spend a significant amount of time in the water. Due to Trainer availability, climate / water conditions and Clubhouse booking with COVID restrictions this course will be conducted in **two** parts:

- 1. THEORY and LAND practical scenario training, where some online learning, study and practice is required at home; and

- Water work sessions are subject to conditions at time. Safety is paramount; in the instances where conditions are not appropriate at Jan Juc, candidates will be moved to Cosy Corner or an alternative day.
- Candidates MUST READ the Public Safety & Aquatic Rescue Training Manual (PSAR) 35th edition; available online, please purchase (\$10) through your <u>SLSA Members Area</u> account. Refer LSV Circular 375:06:20 <u>Release of the online PSAR Training Manual Edition 35</u>
- Candidates MUST complete the eLearning prior to the assessment day. Practising land techniques as much as possible at home is beneficial.

The Bronze Medallion course is a lifesaving skills-based award for people aged 15 years and over. Skills taught include: Safety & wellbeing; Surf awareness & skills; Human body; CPR; Defibrillation techniques; First aid; Communications; Radio operations; Rescue techniques; Carries & supports and Beach Management. Life Saving Services

Jan Juc SLSC provides Beach Patrols from last weekend in November through April. At completion of the Bronze Medallion course candidates will be rostered onto patrols, usually a few half days and few full days over the five month period, or Nipper Water Safety. Suggested Training

It is recommended that participants are now regularly swimming a few times each week.

You would benefit from supported practising of scenarios at home eg CPR, Patient Assessment, First Aid, Signals, Radio and revision of PSAR manual, downloaded prior to the course.

During the course you will require:

Theory and Land Components

- Water bottle
- Brimmed hat/ peak cap
- Beanie
- Warm clothes as we experience varying conditions
- Running gear and shoes
- Learner guide obtained first day
- Pens and highlighters

Water Components

- Bathers
- Pink rash vest mandatory
- Goggles
- Bright coloured swim cap mandatory
- Beach towel
- Wetsuit Long-sleeved/long legs a must
- Sunscreen
- Online PSAR 35 Manual
- Warm clothes and shoes

A positive attitude; enthusiastic to learn in a peer supported environment

*Water work = signals, run-swim-run, tube swims & rescues, board paddling & rescues, lifts & carries. **Long** sleeve/long leg wetsuit a must, to prevent hypothermia.

Cost

The total cost for the Bronze Medallion Course 2021 is \$80, which includes pink rash vest (or Patrol Surf Rescue peak cap if patrolling) and the training expenses. This cost does not include your prepaid membership fee. All club helpers, trainers and assessors will be volunteering their time for the course. BYO Food and drink. Fridge and kettle available.

Should you decide to withdraw, cost less 25% will be refunded up until 11 November 2021; after this date there are no refunds. Your payment (less 25%) may be put towards another course this season.

Licences

A scan of your current Driver's License and Marine License is required to be submitted to the Club Office and the details recorded via your <u>SLSA Members Area</u> account.

ATV drivers must follow Vic Roads guidelines and have completed both theory & practical ATV Operators certificate.

A current 2021/2022 Membership is mandatory. Your membership is not active until ALL membership components are received and processed by the Club Office.

2. Jan Juc SLSC Online Registration Form

The online <u>Registration Form</u> captures all Candidate and Next of Kin details, Confidential Medical Information, Candidate Conduct and Values and Course Helpers. Please complete all pages then submit.

3. Course Payment (due by 11 November 2021)

4. LSV Online Course Registration

Prior to commencing the *Bronze Medallion course* you must register online with Lifesaving Victoria (LSV) by booking into a Practical Session. Follow these steps to do this:

- 1. Log in to your <u>SLSA Members Area</u> account. If you do not have your own account you will need to create one <u>here</u>.
- 2. Click on *eLearning* follow the prompts until you reach LSV Member Training pages (URL https://mt.lsv.com.au/courses/)
- 3. Click on Find a New Course
- 4. Locate the entry for *Bronze Medallion* and click on *Book Practical, look* for the course commencing Monday, 15 November at Jan Juc SLSC.

5. LSV Online Vaccination Status form

Complete this LSV Online Vaccination Status Form as 1 per person.

This form is mandatory and used to collect information regarding your vaccination status as per the directions from the Chief Health Officer under section 200(1)(d) Public Health and Wellbeing Act 2008 (Vic) (PHW Act). As per the PHW Act, penalties will apply from government for any false or misleading information. Collection and storage of vaccination information will be in line with the <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Vaccination Privacy Notice</u>. For more information, please refer to <u>LSV's Vaccination FAQ</u>.

*** Complete the first FIVE ONLINE components by 11 November 2021, PRIOR to Bronze Medallion Course

*** Complete the SIXTH PAPER component (next page) PRIOR to Bronze Medallion Course and bring completed signed form to the first day, Monday 15 November 2021

6. Timed Pool Swim - Compulsory

As part of the Bronze Medallion all candidates are required to achieve a prerequisite TIMED pool swim PRIOR to the Bronze Medallion Course. This must be witnessed and signed by a qualified Pool Lifeguard, AUSTSwim Teacher or LSV Assessor.

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400m of continuous freestyle, without fins (goggles permitted), in 9 minutes maximum is required.
